Right to education: 25 years!

This August, thousands of undocumented children were able to go to school without suffering from discrimination. The right to education is a reality today because of the fight led by CCSI and migrants themselves: 25 years ago, the « illegal » children of seasonal workers came out of the shadows and went to school for the first time! Today, CCSI still fights on your side day after day for children's rights in other fields.

We remind you that education is a fundamental right: schools cannot ask for a residency permit and all children have a right to attend compulsory school, regardless of their nationality and legal status.

Health insurance subsidy

You must ask for the subsidy (financial aid from the State for health insurance) for your child's health insurance each year. If you haven't received the 2016 subsidy yet, please make an appointment with CCSI before the end of the year and bring the insurance policy with you. As soon as you receive the subsidy, please bring a copy of the certificate to our reception with your name and phone number.

The subsidy is a right depending on your income. Requesting it will not affect other proceedings, such as the request for a residency permit. Only children residing in the canton of Geneva have the right to the health insurance subsidy. CCSI cannot request the subsidy for children living in neighboring France.

Primary school: registration

Any child living in Geneva, regardless of his/her legal status, has the right and the obligation to go to school. Children born before 01.08.2012 start school on August 29th 2016.

To be accepted at school, your child must have health insurance. CCSI is in charge of affiliation for children without a residence permit. Make an appointment, and come with the official identification for the child and his/her legal guardian, as well as your address. Your child will be able to start school as soon as you have come to CCSI.

School meals for children

If you live in the city of Geneva and your income is within the range, CCSI can request free school meals for your child. Please come with a copy of the health insurance subsidy and valid passports. For residents of other cities, please ask CCSI if financial aid is available.

Once you have obtained the exoneration, you do not need to bring the invoices to CCSI, you can discard them without paying them. Caution, you must always pay the fixed fees (cotisation in French) and the meals your child didn't attend without a valid excuse.

Health insurance: caution!

If a person calls you on the telephone or comes to your door saying you must change insurance or take on a new contract, DO NOT SIGN ANYTHING! Contact CCSI for all matters regarding your health insurance.

Meet & play for children

For children in pre-school age, Geneva offers several meeting and playing places (open to all and free) where parents and their children meet other parents and children, as well as childcare professionals. Outside school hours, children up to the age of 12 are welcome. Here are a few addresses in Geneva city:

Daycare

It is very difficult to find a place in daycare for pre-school children in Geneva. CCSI can help you increase your chances, but cannot guarantee a place. If you live in Geneva city, go to the Bureau d'Information de la Petite Enfance (BIPE, rue du Cendrier 8). If you live in another area in the canton of Geneva, you must go to the Secteur de la Petite Enfance of your commune - if there is one. If not, pre-register your child in the daycare center(s) closest to your home or workplace. To do so, you must present your child's insurance certificate. After that, CCSI can write a letter of recommendation to support your request. For this, you will need to make an appointment between January and end of March 2017 with the Consultation Petite enfance, santé et genre at CCSI, so that your child can start daycare as of August. Please note that there is no guarantee that your child will have a place in daycare. The cost of monthly payments depends on your income. For fulltime daycare, for the lowest income, the cost is approx. CHF 250 per month. There are currently no financial aids for those costs.

EU work permits

Some employers say they cannot hire EU citizens if they don't yet have a work permit. We remind you that the employer only needs to fill in the EU form. If the job offer is for more than 50%, as a European citizen, you are guaranteed to get a work permit.

Working without a permit

If you are living and working in Switzerland without a permit, it is important to **keep anything that** can prove a work relationship (salary receipts, text messages, emails, etc.). It may be very useful if you decide to request a permit in the future.

Public writers

Public writers ("écrivains publics" in French) can help you write a letter, draft a CV, a cover letter for a job offer, etc. Their help is free and confidential. Please note: they do not deal with legal proceedings or anything to do with taxes! You can find them at the following addresses:
