

G7 Summit in Evian (France) from June 15 to 17, 2026

General information

- The G7 Summit will take place from Monday 15 to Wednesday 17 June in the town of Evian-les-Bains, France, 45 km from Geneva. Several heads of State and government will be present.
- Given Evian's proximity to Geneva, **this event will have significant implications for the Canton of Geneva, particularly in terms of security and mobility.**
- From 8 June until 19 June, the police will significantly step up their presence and checks at borders, on the streets and on public transport (trains, trams and buses). Police reinforcements will also be brought in from other Swiss cantons and from France.
- The areas around the airport, Cornavin station, the city centre (left bank) and near the French border will be under closed surveillance, and the police are likely to step up their checks.
- Several border crossings will be closed, and **systematic, strict checks will be carried out 24 hours a day at the major border crossings that remain open** (e.g. Meyrin, Ferney, Annemasse), including for people crossing on foot, by bike or by bus.
- It is likely that **some streets will be closed to traffic** (both vehicles and pedestrians) or **more difficult to access** during this period. There will certainly be **changes to public transport routes and timetables.**
- On Sunday 14 June, a large demonstration will take place in the city (on the right bank) from 3 pm to protest against the G7.
This demonstration has been authorised by the authorities, but there will be a **heavy police presence** along the entire route of the demonstration, in the station area and elsewhere in the city centre. It is possible **that incidents of violence and material damage** (to vehicles, buildings, shops, etc.) may occur before, during and after this demonstration.
- It is possible that **other unauthorised gatherings or demonstrations** may take place between 8 and 19 June. In that case, the police are likely to intervene.
- The Geneva authorities have urged the population to limit their movements between 12 and 18 June.

CCSI recommendations for its users during the period from 8 to 18 June

To avoid a police check:

- Limit your travel as much as possible throughout this period, whether by car, train/Léman Express, bus, tram, bike/scooter or on foot
- Avoid crossing the border and travelling to France at this time
- Be particularly vigilant in the vicinity of Cornavin station and the airport, as well as in areas close to the French border
- On Sunday 14 June, please avoid the demonstration area (see route below)*
- Read this document about your rights in the event of control or arrest by the police

In any case:

- Make sure you always carry your ID with you
- Plan your journeys carefully and allow extra time to get to work, your child's school, or an appointment
- If you need to take the bus, tram or Léman Express, make sure you have your TPG travelcard or a valid ticket. Check the TPG website or app to see if there are any changes to routes or timetables
- Some associations, administrative services, shops, medical services, etc. may change their opening hours or even close to the public during this period.
If you have an appointment somewhere, please check carefully whether you have received any information by email or text message. If you do not have an appointment, check online or by phone that the place you are going to is indeed open.
- If you have an appointment at the CCSI between 10 and 18 June and would like to reschedule it for another date, please email us as soon as possible at accueil@ccsi.ch, stating your phone number.
- Keep up to date with the situation by checking with people you trust or reliable information sources
